We frequently have questions come in regarding services offered. At this time, this is a snapshot of services available to each level.

# Independent and Assisted Living Offer

- Maintenance Free Living
- Utilities Included (electric, water, trash)
- Lawn Care
- Transportation available for shopping
- Community wide Chapel service- when able
- Community events- when able
- Pet friendly
- Access to skilled/rehab care/physical therapy
- Meals- Plans available for IL & Meals included in AL

Valley View Village does not offer catered or enhanced style support services for our independent living community. We do support, value, and respect your full independence and ability to manage every day living. There are many non-medical home health agencies in the area that can assist with almost all of your daily needs, so you can remain independent in your apartment as long as possible. You have freedom of choice to use these agencies and self manage these services.

As a reminder, if you are having any issues or concerns, management will address them with the parties listed on the lease. Valley View staff are not allowed to help IL tenants up from a fall. We also do not offer wellness checks. 911 or non-emergency must be called in these situations.

- Independent living apartments with in-house support services- if needed
- Personalized service plans- not everyone requires, needs, or wants daily services. Assisted Living tenants are <u>still independent</u>.
- Emergency response pendant
- Package delivery to your door

Call Alexis with questions! 299-1740 Every person's life has an interesting story to tell or a song to sing. Valley View Village is full of such people! What follows is a brief summary of the interesting life song of Valley View resident, Harriett Burns. Harriett, now 92, was born on a farm two miles north of Wellsburg, Ia and is the youngest of eight children, and the last surviving sibling.

She attended both elementary and secondary school in Wellsburg. When Harriett was 17, she began working as a bookkeeper for a local implement store. That same year, her good friend talked her into going on a blind (for her and her soon to be husband) double date and was married later that same year to John for 35 years.

In 1964 Harriett and John opened Burns Grocery, better known as "Little John's Superette" by locals, in Steamboat Rock, raising three daughters along the way. Sarah, Rosie, and Mykle (who lives just three blocks from Valley View) keep her well supplied with sweets and visits during normal times! When her husband John passed at the young age of 58 in 1981, Harriett kept the store running for another 10 years before deciding that she was ready for a new chapter to begin.

Thus began a new season in Harriett's life. Harriett had friends who had worked at Yellowstone Park for several years and talked about what a joy it was to work there. So, she decided to give it a go and for the next 20 years she would live and work at the Yellowstone Lake Hotel in Yellowstone National Park between Memorial Day and Labor Day, while residing at her home in Iowa during the offseason.

She began working as a maid, but was soon promoted to porter. She insists that this "promotion" was due to the fact that she could never figure out the correct way to make the beds. As a porter, she tended to the needs of the clientele. At this time, there were no phones in the rooms so messages had to be hand delivered. She also worked as a waitress in the hotel restaurant which overlooked majestic Yellowstone Lake. She loved it! "It was so beautiful...just lovely," she says. She used to enjoy sitting in the ballroom listening to the string quartet play into the night. Over the years, she has met the King and Queen of Norway, Jimmy Carter, and others of note.

Harriett and her husband were long time members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church located two miles northeast of Wellsburg. She keeps a beautiful snowy-night picture of this church front and center in her room. Harriett deeply loves, and is very proud of her church. And for good reason! Her great, great uncle donated the land on which the building now stands, after returning from the Civil War in 1865. Previously the church folks had moved from house to house. This church is where Harriett was baptized, confirmed, married, taught children's SS and served on the Church Council. Buildings can hold very special memories indeed! They may be constructed with bricks, wood, plaster, and glass but the memories are indestructible.

Harriett is a bird lover extraordinaire! The walls of her room are filled with pictures of birds, common and rare alike. She keeps a detailed diary of the numbers and species of birds that she has seen over the years and is always eager to talk about ornithology.
